One of the integral parts of our weekend away is the feeling of community that we're able to build through visiting, playing and working together with friends—old and new. Chores vary for age and ability and may be traded with others on site as necessary.



ABOUT THE SITE

Tar Hollow State Park is located in the rolling hills just southeast of Chillicothe, Ohio. The park is full of hiking trails that wind their way through the dense woodlands of short leaf and tar pine trees. For three days and two nights our home is at the Tar Hollow Resident Camp which includes an out-of-the-movies old lodge, a couple of cabins suitable for folks with special needs and/or younger children (let us know if you need access to these, they are first-come, first-served basis), and four hillsides of rustic cabins. We also have use of the lake for fishing, kayaks and canoes, a large meadow for camping (if you prefer), and a chapel in the woods. New beach this year!

CAMPING WITH STYLE

Hillside cabins offer Campers rustic ambiance. We sleep up to eight per cabin in single, bunk beds. Though there is no heat in the cabins, coming prepared with lots of clothing & warm bedding provides for comfort and a pleasant, sheltered camping experience. Each hill has its own co-ed bath house with hot showers and other running water amenities.

The lodge houses two huge fireplaces and the modern kitchen where we cook our gourmet meals! Speaking of meals... This year promises to be full of more good eatin'! Pancakes for breakfast, chili for lunch, and garlic chicken for dinner Saturday night. Vegetarian fare is also available, and the kitchen is accessible for folks with special needs.
